


A Sign of Respect: Strategies for Effective Deaf/Hearing Interactions by Thomas K. Holcomb and Anna Mindess

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1. Go to the home page at www.treehousevideo.com and scroll down until you see the two boxes with “Have a Code From Your Teacher?” and “Have a Code From Your Bookstore?”.




2. If you purchased (or will purchase) your access from the bookstore, go to Step 4. If you want to purchase online, you need to get a code from your teacher. Your teacher will pass around a list of codes. Choose one and write it down exactly as it appears, including the dashes. The code is in all caps. Be careful to note the difference between the number 0 and the letter O, and the number 1 and the letter I. Then at the home page, select “Have a Code From Your Teacher?”



3. Fill out all the required fields, and in the Group Code field type in the code that you chose from the list your teacher passed around in class. You will also create a password for your account, enter your billing information and check out. To learn how to access and use the program, go to Step 6.

- If you purchased (or plan to purchase) your access from the bookstore, you will be given a printed coupon in a sealed envelope. Have that code ready, then go to the website www.treehousevideo.com and at the home page select “Have a Code From Your Bookstore?”



- Fill out all the required fields, and in the Group Code field type in the code printed on the coupon you purchased from the bookstore. Type the code exactly as it appears, including the dashes. The code is in all caps. Be careful to note the difference between the number 0 and the letter O, and the number 1 and the letter I. Now go to Step 6 on the next page.





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
Welcome to "A Sign of Respect" – Part One

- Select the unit from the list below to go to the contents for that unit. To return to this page any time, select the "A Sign of Respect 1" link at the top of the page.



11. To go to a specific part of a unit, you can click the arrow next to the name of the unit to reveal the contents and make your selection:



There are three types of activities in the program:

- **WATCH** - a video is displayed for you to watch. You will have the ability to replay the video when it is completed. If it is a **CHOICE POINT** video, make a note of the choice you made and view the feedback. Then go back to look at the feedback provided for the other choices.
- **READING** - read the article. If there are links to other readings or internet sites, these will open in a new window on your browser.
- **EXERCISE** - Exercise pages have a blue button. Click on the button to open the exercise file. It will open in the word processing file on your computer. You may see a dialogue box asking you to specify how to handle the file as described in the next section.



What are some of the stereotypes that are often attributed to Deaf people? How accurate are these stereotypes based on your personal experiences with Deaf people so far?
